# COVID RESTRICTIONS

Unfortunately, the Government has informed schools that we cannot have events for parents such as parent tours of the school, parent evenings, and performances to parents during lockdown.

As such please note that the Parent Forums and Parent Curriculum Learning Evenings have been cancelled for this term. Please note that currently the new website needs all of these events updating on the calendar section.

It is likely that the Stay and Play in KS1 and the Celebration of Learning across the school on Tues 8th and Thurs 10th December will be cancelled – but we will keep you informed as we would be hopeful to go ahead with them.

We are planning on holding the Nativities 'live' to parents. The performances will be limited to Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December 10am for Oak and 2pm for Elm with 2 adults per child.

We are still hopeful to be able to hold the Christingle service on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December on the following times: Oak 5.30pm, Elm 6pm, Fir 6.30pm, Ash 7pm.

# **Education** settings

More evidence has emerged that shows there is a very low risk of children becoming very unwell from COVID-19, even for children with existing health conditions. Most children originally identified as clinically extremely vulnerable no longer need to follow this advice. Speak to your GP or specialist clinician, if you have not already done so, to understand whether your child should still be classed as clinically extremely vulnerable.

Those children whose doctors have confirmed they are still clinically extremely vulnerable are advised not to attend school while this advice is in place. Your school will make appropriate arrangements for you to be able to continue your education at home. Children who live with someone who is clinically extremely vulnerable, but who are not clinically extremely vulnerable themselves, should still attend school.

### **PHOTOGRAPHS**

The FOCBS has organised photographs of the children to be on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> November. Children can be dropped off at the usual times. Children must be in school uniform, with PE being cancelled that day. Those children who do after school clubs can bring in a change of clothes for their club.

Pre-school sibling photographs will begin at 9am. Please advise the School Office if you plan to attend at this time. In school siblings will follow, and finally individual photos a class at a time.
