This term our Value for Life is BELIEF. There have been some wonderful moments this term with the children reflecting on their belief in themselves to achieve their dreams, their belief in their friends and family, and their belief in God.

Recently we have been enjoying (re)discovering the meaning of the Advent season, the 4 candles in the Advent wreath and the single candle in the middle of the Advent wreath. The children have also enjoyed the gift of a Christingle from the Church to take home, and the daily activities in the Advent booklet sent out at the start of December from the School.

The children also enjoyed writing their 'Wish for the World' in a Christmas decoration to hang up in the Reflection garden. Here are some of the beautiful wishes:

### COVID ARRANGEMENTS CHRISTMAS HOLIDAY AND JANUARY ONWARDS

If parents or children become symptomatic or have a positive Covid test in the 6 days following the last day of term please follow the Public Health England Track and Trace guidelines and also notify the school via the school office email: office@coombebissett.wilts.sch.uk

The school email will be regularly checked until the end of the 24th December, as we are part of the Track and Trace network, but the school telephone will not be monitored and the school will not be open. If there are any symptomatic cases or positive cases in this period, that we are notified about then we will issue the standard

Wiltshire notification letters to parents. As you are aware we cannot identify the individuals and we will not be answering any emails regarding any cases, as per guidance.

From January, because of the uncertainty surrounding the potential impact of the relaxation of restrictions over Christmas, we will be continuing with the precautions we currently have in place:

- high standards of hygiene with regular handwashing and hand sanitiser by all
- high standards of cleaning with staff cleaning down touch plates regularly throughout the day and with our cleaners continuing with the Yellow Provision put in place since March
- class bubbles with separate toilets, but with the outdoor double bubble for play/lunch, and the 'Early' and 'Late' club bubbles inside the hall in their respective zones
- staggered start and finish times as currently
- adults wearing facemasks when moving around the school until they are in the classroom
- lots of ventilation in each class (whilst maintaining thermal comfort)
- outdoor PE (even though guidance seems to be changing to allow some indoor PE as long as there is good ventilation and reduced numbers)
- cleaning down of sports equipment between users
- specific resources for each class not sharing between classes unless it has been anti-bacterial cleaned in between sessions

We will be reviewing our approach to music and singing in the light of recent recommendations that things can be relaxed.

Hot meals will no longer be served with disposable items, rather we will be returning to plates and cutlery – these are stored separately from other schools and are cleaned in the dishwasher.

Cover teaching: for Oak will be within bubble; for Elm it will be from Mr Basinger-Adams and Mrs Bowers; for Fir and Ash it will be from Mr Basinger-Adams. Whilst distance will be maintained this does increase the potential for transmission across bubbles, as has always been the case for behavior management and First Aid.

After a short period of time we will be reviewing our bubbles approach, and will be considering running key stage bubbles or ideally one whole school bubble as is the case in many small primary schools, so that the children can experience the joys they have been missing such as collective worship, peer leadership, reading buddies, etc.

All of these precautions remain, of course, dependent on any changes recommended in Government Guidelines.

# THIS CHRISTMAS – VALUE FOR LIFE CHALLENGE

As with last term, and in various years previously, we would love children to create something over Christmas to show their thoughts on 'BELIEF'. It could be: a picture of them doing something with a caption to explain; a poem or a piece of writing – a wonderful short story would be amazing; a painting, drawing, collage or a sculpture; a picture of a special piece of cookery – the children made some 'fimo-art' recently and this fun piece of Christmas Cake decoration in the image below may remind them of this activity.



Please can children bring it in during the first week back. It is so lovely for the children to see what each of them have been thinking about over the break in relation to BELIEF. These can then be put up on display.

### AUTUMN TERM TEAM TOKENS WINNING HOUSE

Every day and every lesson every child has the opportunity to earn Team tokens for such things as great learning, great manners, great kindness, great effort, and much more. The children love it! Each week the tokens are added up across the school. At the end of each season the final totals are announced.

This Autumn the total tokens achieved across the school were: Red = 1800, Yellow = 1649, Blue = 1716, Green = 1712. This is a huge amount earned by each Team, and a total of 6877 magical moments to be proud of, to warm our hearts, to celebrate! Congratulations to every child for their magnificent efforts, but an extra-special congratulation to Red Team who won the Autumn Tokens Trophy. Each child in the winning Team receives a prize and the winning Team get to choose the Charity for the next term. Children thus recognize their efforts benefit themselves, their community, and those people beyond that they may never even meet. The charity the winning Team have chosen is 'WWF Sky Ocean'. School Council will be organizing the date and event for fundraising for this charity and this will be announced next term. Here is Red Team's words about the next school charity, chosen by the children:

"For our Spring charity next year, we've decided to donate to the WWF Sky Ocean fund to help with projects that tackle plastic pollution in our oceans. We chose this because many of us are animal lovers and because plastic in the oceans is a crucial problem. By donating to the World Wildlife Fund we will help them and the Sky Ocean Rescue to restore the seas. The reason we didn't choose a recycling charity is because only 9% of plastics can actually be recycled. Too much plastic is clogging up the oceans and we want to help by choosing this charity this Spring."

#### **ATTENDANCE**

Thank you for all your efforts in ensuring your child has good attendance. This has been an incredible effort and we have been so delighted that children have been in school so much.

In Term 1 our attendance was well over 96% which was way above national attendance rates at that period (around 85-90%). In Term 2 our attendance dropped to 89.9%, as was to be expected. Our current cumulative attendance rate for the academic year since September is 92.9%. All figures include self-isolation / class remote learning due to Covid suspected or positive cases, as this is recorded as being educated off-site and not as an absence.
