PARENT / TEACHER CONSULTATIONS

PARENT LEARNING EVENING – WEDNESDAY 1ST DECEMBER

The Parent Learning Evening on Wednesday 1st will be an excellent opportunity for parents to find out how to maximize their child's learning. So many children across the country have fallen behind age related expectations so this evening will be an opportunity for parents to really identify how to help their children to catch-up. If you are unable to attend then we cannot stress enough the vital importance of the following:

- Reading at home with your child at least 4 times a week national statistics have identified that the gap between children not achieving a grade 4 at GCSE and those that exceeded a grade 4 has been attributed in a large part to early reading at home with parents in their Primary School years.
- Attendance the same statistical analysis also identified that those attending below 95% did not achieve the 104 standardised score that is the national average, those attending 90% did not achieve the 100% pass mark indicating secondary school readiness.

REMEMBRANCE

We hope you enjoyed seeing the remembrance service display in the remembrance garden.

The children and staff joined Rev Jenny for a beautiful Remembrance Service at 11am on the 11th. They laid a wreath, presented their memories through artwork and shared prayers. The flag was also lowered to half-mast. A supply teacher we had that day said it was the most beautiful Remembrance service she had ever seen in a Primary School.

In the afternoon, Ash class went to the War Memorial and laid a wreath and called out the names of departed soldiers from this area. They were joined by Rev Jenny, some parishioners and some veterans.

NATIVITY PRODUCTIONS - FILMING AND PRODUCTION

Unfortunately, this year Mrs Webster is unable to film the KS1 nativities and produce the copies as she has done on many occasions to great benefit for families and the FOCBS fundraising.

School staff do not have the equipment to do so.

ATTENDANCE

Term 1 attendance results were:

Overall = 93.6%
YR= 84.8%
<mark>Y1= 95.8%</mark>
<mark>Y2= 92.9%</mark>
Y3= 96.2%
<mark>Y4= 94.7%</mark>
<mark>Y5= 93%</mark>
<mark>Y6= 94%</mark>

The National Average sits at 96% - so we are hopeful to improve these figures in Term 2.

Congratulations to Year 3 who won the Attendance Trophy for Term 1, and congratulations to the large numbers of children whose attendance was above 96% - we even had many at 100% !

Thank you to those parents who adapted their school journeys to accommodate the disruptions caused by the train crash in order to ensure their child was still at school at 8.50am and before the register closes and lessons begin at 9.00am.

On the flip-side, we are also very grateful to those parents who followed guidelines around covid safety and school attendance – helping to keep the rest of the children and staff safe.

National guidelines are that attendance falling below 90% is a cause for concern, perhaps even an indicator of a safeguarding concern, and as such schools should hold School Attendance Meetings (SAMs) with parents. We recognize that many of the children falling below this level in Term 1 was completely due to Covid illness / acute illness and as such we are not issuing SAMs for these. However, where this is not the case a SAM will be issued.

National and Local Authority guidelines are that continued absence below 90% across a couple of terms may be liable to a fine being issued by the local authority (this is nothing to do with the school).
