MINI-PARENT SURVEY = AREAS TO SUPPORT PARENTS

Thank you for the return of the Survey regarding the aspects that parents would like support advice on but in a dedicated learning evening for parents. We had 10 returns. The key aspects identified by parents were:

- Learning powers
- Relationships and Sex Education
- Social Media and online safety
- Reading & Phonics, Maths, Writing things parents could do at home to support

We have identified Wednesday 18th May as a dedicated time for this learning evening, which will focus mainly on Relationships and Sex Education but will also cover learning power, and supporting the core subjects at home.

We hope to be able to employ an outside speaker to provide a parent learning evening on Social Media and we will let you know when this is confirmed.

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING

All schools are being encouraged to increase their focus on pupil and staff mental health and wellbeing and to have a dedicated qualified Senior Mental Health Lead in school to co-ordinate the development in this area. The SMHL is Mr Basinger-Adams who has completed the training this Christmas.

We define wellbeing as physical, emotional, social, mental and spiritual health combined.

We will be tweaking our curriculum to highlight and support wellbeing for children even further. We will be adapting our systems and operations to support the wellbeing of staff – working hard to reduce staff workload in line with Government recommendations for education staff.
