Our guided reading fiction text this term is 'Where the Mountain Meets the Moon' by Grace Lin with accompanying non-fiction research on China. In our writing, we will complete units on discussion texts, preparing evidence for both sides of an issue, and learning techniques for building tension in a 'fear' story.

PSHE

Our SCARF units this term are on the theme of 'Being my Best'. We will look at a wide range of themes including keeping fit, setting personal goals and recognising our own talents.

Maths

We begin the term by revisiting measure, focussing on how to convert between metric and imperial units. Other units will focus on: multiples, factors and mental strategies to support addition and subtraction; number and place value and our Year 6s will be learning all about algebra and how numbers can be represented by letters.

Science

Properties and changes of materials

We will compare and group materials based on properties including hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity and response to magnets. Experiments will include dissolving and recovery of materials.
