## Rewards this Week A Reminder about Team Points & Green Cards

**Team Points** are awarded for work – for example whether it is particularly difficult, particularly challenging for a specific child, or whether they have demonstrated perseverence – stickatitability.

Each week's Team Point scores will be added to those of preceding weeks to make a cumulative score over the whole year.

**Green Cards** are based on school values (this term's is Belief) and will be awarded to children who show how they fulfil one of the targets on the card. Any member of school staff can award a Green Card to any child. The Green Cards are counted in two ways:

They are counted by House and added to the Team Point Scores, to see which house will get the House Trophy. They are counted by Class each week to see which class will have a non-uniform day the following week.
