Please take a moment to read the following facts regarding school attendance

Attendance

A school year for children is 190 school days. Attendance of 95% for the year equals 10 days that a child has been absent, that is 2 full weeks of a child's learning missed for that year.

• Attendance of 90% for the year equals 19 days that a child has been absent, that is almost 4 school weeks missed.

• Attendance of 85% for the year equals 29 days that a child has been absent, that is almost 6 weeks of school missed.

• Attendance of 80% for the year equals 38 days that a child has been absent, that is over 7 weeks of school missed.

Did you know that there are **175 days** per year when your child does not have to attend school? These days can be used to:

- Spend time together
- Go on family visits
- Go on holiday
- Go shopping
- Go on days out
- Attend routine appointments

Requests for Leave in term time will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

By law, only the head teacher can authorise your child's absence. It is important to keep the school informed if your child is going to be absent as soon as possible at the start of the day.
