
# A Reminder about Team Points & Green Cards

#### Outside Education & Historical Experience for the public on the Harnham Water Meadows

There will be public demonstrations of "drowning" or "floating" of a section of the meadows by The Harnham Water Meadows Trust on Saturdays 28th January and 11th February 2023. They start at 10:00am outside Rose Cottage, Harnham (on the Town Path on the far side of the radial gates from Harnham Old Mill Hotel). Adults and children are welcome. Wellington boots and warm clothing are recommended. The ground is rough under foot and will be very wet in some places. There is no charge for attending but donations are welcome because the Trust relies on public donations to keep the Water Meadows maintained and functioning.

Details will be published on the home page of the website: salisburywatermeadows.org.uk under events and on the sign outside Rose Cottage. The demonstration is always reliant on suitable water-levels in the River Nadder.
