

Letter from the Headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a really fantastic week in school, made especially special by Wednesday's visitor to Key Stage 2. We were very fortunate to welcome into school Krishna from Hinduism Educational Experiences who came to share with the children insight into the Hindu faith: what it means to be Hindu and the traditions, beliefs and rituals of the religion. The children ere able to learn firsthand through a range of experiences including storytelling, dressing up in traditional Indian costume, plus other topic and activities related to Hindu worship, values and lifestyle. They had an amazing day and have been talking about it animatedly since! Central to Christianity are the values of tolerance, respect and acceptance and I am very grateful to the Christian organisation, Sarum St Michael Educational Charity, based in Salisbury for helping us to sponsor this event which allowed the children the opportunity to learn about others outside of our community.

There was a lot of deep discussion and head scratching as we considered the question 'What is spirituality?' and I believe that there will be many more conversations to come. 
