Dear Parents and Carers,

Belief is our value of the term and this morning, showing my age, I had a real Victor Meldrew moment when I heard myself saying, 'I don't believe it...' I was checking our Children in Need landing page before assembly and could not believe what I was seeing! At the time of writing the



newsletter, as a school community, we have raised a staggering £1317.21

and I am truly blown away! THANK YOU all. On Monday, we also had our Odd Sock Day to mark the start of Anti-Bullying week. Throughout the week children have been focusing in their classes on 'Make a Noise, the theme of this year's campaign. In their PSHE lessons they have drawn posters to illustrate the need to stand up for what is right, for themselves and for others. It is imperative that children understand what bullying is (and what it isn't), that it will not be tolerated in the CB community and that we all have a responsibility to 'make a noise' and speak up if we feel that someone else is being treated unfairly or unkindly. These conversations happen on a regular basis in school and the children have a very clear understanding of the topic, but Anti-Bullying week allows for even more of these conversations.

Today, Ash class have gone to the Science Museum in Winchester for a day of hands on learning and a chance to visit the planetarium. I am sure that there will be lots to tell you next week!
