#### CHRISTMAS MINI FAYRE

Each year the Friends of Coombe Bissett School run a fun Christmas Mini Fayre for the children where they have the opportunity to buy and wrap surprise Christmas gifts for their families.

This year the Christmas Mini Fayre will be held in the school hall on Friday 8th Dec. The children will be able to go shopping at the tayre during the school marning to buy gifts with their own money. Parents are not expected to attend but helpers are warmly welcomed to assist on the stalls and wrap the presents. We will be putting a shout out for helpers on Facebook, if you would like to come along then please sign up there.

On the day please send your child(ren) to school with a carrier bag (to put their aifts into), some money and a maximum of 5 gift lobels per child - each filled out with the name of who the gift is for and who it is from. The gifts on sale will be relatively inexpensive, ranging in price from 50p to £2 (wrapping service included). £5 should be plenty per child to buy 5 gifts.

In order to stock the Christmas Mini Fayre we ask that each child bring in 5 small gifts which can be sold. These can be donations of unwanted gifts or small new items such as soap, bars of chocolate, diaries socks, pens, candles, hair accessories, key rings, books, stickers etc.
