Letter from the Headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers.

Christmas came early this week as we received the report from our SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection! I am SO very proud of the report and everything that it says about our school, children, staff and community and it made for the perfect end to a very special term!

As you will see from the full report which is attached with this newsletter and will be available on the website, we have received 'Judgement One'.

This is the highest judgement achievable and suggests that, through the school's vision and practice, we are living up to our foundation as a Church school enabling pupils and adults to flourish. I believe that the inspector really understood our school and she has highlighted how: 'Relationships at all levels are strong and supportive, because the school's values are lived and breathed.'

She also praised the school saying, 'School leaders promote a culture of wellbeing and nurture which supports the flourishing of all members of the community. Relationships, built on trust and mutual respect, sustain a committed staff team. These are modelled well to pupils who, in turn, care for each other'. Mrs Corbyn also commented on how the vision and values of the school 'ensure that creativity and curiosity enable all to thrive'.

It is wonderful to see the staff receiving the praise that they so rightly deserve and I especially liked the phrase: 'the staff are full of warmth and invested on an individual level' with the pupils'. The inspection was also highly complimentary of our relationship with the church and most especially Rev Jenny. Rev Jenny is an incredibly important member who is loved by so many of us and I am so pleased that this unique bond, and its impact on the children and staff, has been recognised.

Quite rightly, the inspection acknowledges the period of uncertainty that the school has been through, but it also states that 'Coombe Bissett's Christian vision is supporting necessary change whilst providing the nurture and care that everyone needs to bring this about'.

I could not be prouder of the report and all that it says about our school.. It is testament to our children, staff, governors and parent body that this report reflects the commitment of the whole school community to 'soar on wings like eagles'. It truly is an extraordinary school, where everyone, child or adult, is known and valued as an individual and our strong Christian ethos and values help ensure that everyone flourishes and I am so very lucky to be its headteacher!
