Letter from the Headteacher...


Dear Parents and Carers.

We had a fantastic time on Monday when we welcomed a representative from the Wiltshire Air Ambulance to school. I think that our school may be the safest place around following his visit! The children were taught to do CPR, use a defibrillator, ring 999, what to do if someone is choking (please remember to cut grapes horizontally!) and place someone in the recovery position. Everyday we hope that the children learn something new, but Monday's learning was extra special. It is not every day that we are given the skills to potentially save someone's life. Thank you to Mrs Bowers for arranging the visit.



On Monday we also gave our pencils to Rev Jenny for her husband to take to South Sudan. Together we collected over 600 pencils! This is phenomenal! It is extraordinary to think that something as small as a pencil can make such a difference to someone's life. Our pencils are truly going to make a difference to the pupils at Cueibet School.

Today in Collective Worship as well as celebrating our children and their achievements, I also talked about World Religions Day. World Religion Day is celebrated every year in January. It was established in 1950 as a way to encourage interfaith understanding. The day aims to promote understanding and peace between all religions, encouraging people to learn about other faiths. I read out teachings from



each of the six major religions and we discussed that all of them, without exception, talks about treating everyone with love and respect and in the manner we would want to be treated. We know that this is central to our Christian faith, but it is a good reminder in

these troubled times, that we have far more in common with people than we do differences and we should always be led by respect, acceptance and kindness.

We have an exciting week next week. On Tuesday the children will be having a series of workshops focussing on the importance of

looking after our mental health: The Brain: Calming our Mind (Ash); Protecting Myself—Body and Mind (Fir); Taking Care of our Feelings (Elm) and Bouncing Back (Oak). We will be welcoming a representative from CORAM Scarf education to lead these sessions and I am sure that they will be beneficial for our children.

With a continued focus on looking after ourselves, Key Stage 1 will be having a talk about looking after their teeth and the importance of dental hygiene. Thank you to Matilda's mum for leading these sessions. It is so important to our general health that it is now statutory that we teach dental hygiene in Early Years.

On Friday, it is the annual Sale of Sales. I am reliably told that, 'The best way to describe the Sale of Sales is " It's like Rockbourne Fair... but it's sale and smaller..." It's the final date in the trading diary and the last chance to sell off the past season's stock, before the spring fair kicks off at Birmingham NEC the following week. So it is the Sale of Sales! Stallholders come from all around the country to support the event. The profits made from the door, cafe, and stall holders fees are split between the school and Salisbury

The event is attended by around 256 people and makes £1600 profit which is split equally. In the past, we have made over £2500.

The Founder Daphne Woolnough lives in Coombe Bissett, she started The Sale of Sales many years ago as she wanted to support The Salisbury Hospice, in 2018 Daphne reached out to our school for support and we've happily working together ever since.




The primary teaching of every religion?
