Letter from the Headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our value this term is 'Creativity' and this week we have really seen the spotlight shone upon it!

Yesterday after school, the choir treated us to an amazing rendition of a performance called 'You're Special'. They performed for their invited guests and were absolutely amazing! It is worth noting that the very oldest member of our choir is only nine years old and they have only been singing together for part of this academic year. The entire audience was very impressed by their singing (and a little emotional too) and we have decided that they were so good that it would be a shame not to share their talents, and the very important message they shared through their performance, with a wider audience.
